MINUTES

Honoré Mercier Home & School

Tuesday, September 27, 2022 | Meeting called to order by Nancy Cantini and Mary Scicchitano

Welcome - Opening Remarks

Home and School co-chairs Nancy Cantini and Mary Scicchitano welcomed the parents, teachers, and administrators in attendance. They were happy to see everyone in person and that H&S activities could be planned as before.

Approval of the June 2022 Minutes and Agenda for September 27

- Motion to approve the June 2022 minutes and agenda for September 27 called by Catherine Campanile, seconded by Mary Scicchitano. Passed unanimously. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report

- Treasurer Catherine Campanile presented the Balance Sheet for 2021-2022 school year. Year end is July 31, 2022. Total balance as of July 31, 2022, is of \$15,916.35. A few loose ends from grade 6 related expenses remain to be tied up from last year which brings the total balance moving forward to \$14,243.
- Membership cheques are being received until the end of October.
- Catherine reported that this would be her last year as Treasurer, but that H&S would be in very good hands next year as Arianna Lysowych would be taking over.
- Approval of 2022/2023 Budget:
 - Two budget items are seeing a slight increase for this year – Welcome Day and Fun in the Sun. There is also a slight increase in miscellaneous funds.
 - Estimated costs for this year total \$8,778.
 - Motion to approve the 2022-2023 budget called by Stephanie Rossy, seconded by Sandra Simonetti. Passed unanimously. Motion carried.

Liaison Reports

- Principal's Report
 - Sonia Marotta thanked Nancy, Maria, and H&S volunteers for organizing a great Welcome Day. A big thank you goes out to Veronica Graniero, Peter Tsatoumas and Andrew Martinez for their support during day "0s".
 - First day of school was extra special as the EMSB launched their RESPECT program at Honoré Mercier School. Received some very good ideas from teaching staff on how to promote this initiative throughout the year.
 - Thank you to Dina Martino and Toni Morena for their work on beautifying the hallways.
- Teachers' Report
 - Melissa Mazzotta read a lovely note written by kindergarten teacher Nancy Omobono. The note talked about all the great things students were reading and learning to help ease them into school including The Kissing Hand, David Shannon books, and Chick, Chick Boom, Boom. Melissa also reported that grade 5 students are collecting batteries for a greening initiative. The more batteries collected; the better chance HM has of getting funds from the initiative. Lastly, grade six is organizing an event around Orange

Shirt Day on September 30. Students have painted rocks with messages around the "Every Child Matters" theme. These rocks will be laid out at Delorme Park.

- Christine Lagarde reported that everything is going very well in grade 1 and that the start of school has been positive with things going back to more of a normal state. Teachers are planning field trips. Due to staff shortages many trips will need to be rescheduled or plans will need to be changed entirely.

Committee Reports

- Home and School Membership Drive
 - Nancy Cantini thanked everyone who has joined H&S.
 - Nancy Cantini reported that about 45 parents have signed up this year so far. The deadline to sign up is October 28. The fee to join is \$24. \$22 goes to QFHSA and \$2 goes to cover HM H&S administrative costs.
- Welcome Day
 - Maria Scicchitano thanked everyone who volunteered to make Welcome Day a big success.
 - Children had a great time eating corn and playing carnival games/games in the park, schoolyard, and gym. Grade 6 students helped to shuck corn.
- Halloween Volunteers
 - A call for volunteers was announced for the annual Halloween celebration that featured a haunted house held in the library. Time slots for volunteering are October 27 and October 28 in the evening for prep & decoration; October 31 all day for the event; and possibly November 1 for take down. Parents can sign up after the meeting.
 - Former HM parent Daniella Bella has graciously volunteered her time to help prepare the haunted house and train parents on how to do things for next year. Thank you to Daniella for her help in carrying on this great event.
 - Meeting for this event will be scheduled soon.
- Book Fair Volunteers
 - The Scholastic Book Fair will be held on November 23-24. Parent volunteers will be required to set up in the evening on November 22 and will work shifts on November 23 (sale for children) and November 24 (sale during parent-teacher meetings).
 - Meeting for this event will be scheduled soon
- Chocolate Drive
 - The chocolate drive will be the main fundraiser for the year. Funds collected will go towards addressing school needs in different ways (i.e., acquiring gym equipment, library shelves, furniture, etc.).
 - Laura Secord chocolates will be handed out this week.
 - Chocolate Drive will run 3-4 weeks.
 - If you require additional boxes, please speak with H&S chairs.
 - All parents were sent a letter indicating that they should email the H&S address if they do not want their child to participate. They should indicate the child's name and class number.
 - Cheques preferred.
 - Fundraiser could bring up to \$15,000.

- Parent asked how volunteers get chosen to attend different events. Mary and Nancy outlined the process as follows:

- Events are announced at H&S meetings and parents who attend can sign up to be involved on the spot
- Following the meeting an email is sent to all H&S members.
- Everyone who signs up will be contacted regarding the event that identified that they want to volunteer for.
- If an event is oversubscribed, parents who have not participated before are prioritized.
- Parent asked if any other fundraisers will be held. Nancy and Maria mentioned that the TCBY year-long fundraiser may be organized as it's quite popular. More information to come.



Approval of Adoption of the Minutes September 2022

- Amendments:
 - Update on Committee for enrollment: the email did not discuss "enrollment numbers"; amend to reflect activities.
 - Music Teacher's report: it is the CBC Music Classroom Competition, recorded Nov. 9
- Motion to approve the amended October 2022 adoption of the meeting minutes called by Merika Ramundo, seconded by Lisa Ida. Passed unanimously. Motion carried.

Word from chair

- Appreciation given to the rapid action taken by Ms. Marotta to ensure the website was updated with previous GB minutes

- Note of appreciation to the teachers for their efforts, and the parents who participate as well.
- We are going to implement a system borrowed from the CPC to ensure future meetings to do not go on so long:
 - Starting with December meeting we will allocate times for each topic
 - A member of the board acts as timekeeper and ensures limits are not exceeded. Speakers from GB must raise their hand and timekeeper keeps track of the list of speakers.
 - At 1 minute remaining, the board is notified, and a vote is taken on whether to extend the allocated time. If yes, discussion is extended, if not, discussion ends with the final minute
- For November meeting, Tony Campione is the timekeeper.
- Reminder: Only voting members of the GB can ask questions on the topic. Non-voting members can ask questions during the Question/Varia period.

Principals' Report

- Educational Project Annual Report 2021-2022
 - We will return to the full report as of 2023
 - Survey was sent to grades 4-5-6, conducted in the computer lab and was distributed to GB. Main results:
 - 94% of students have positive relationships (84% is norm)
 - 75 % have a sense of belonging and feel accepted and valued by their peers (79% is the norm)
 - Cycle 3 Math success rate 79.2% in 2022 (up from 64.7% in 2019)
 - Cycle 3 ELA success rate: reading 83.3% in 2022 (down from 100% in 2019), writing 97.2% 2022 (down from 98.5% in 2019)
 - Annual report will be published on the website
 - **Motion to approve the project report by Tony Campione, seconded by Andrew Martinez. Passed unanimously**
- Monthly Golden Apple:
 - Ms. Chelsea was nominated by Mr. Peter:
No matter the situation, or what is asked of her she is always there with a smile and very cooperative. She interacts with everyone. Thank you, Ms. Chelsea!
- Book fair was held today, November 23 at the school by Home & School.

Teachers' Report

- Ms. Marianna, Speaking on behalf of classroom teachers
 - The Committee on enrollment was very clear on the implementation of more STEAM, robotics and entrepreneurship projects. On account of the pandemic, we did have to put a pause on all projects and it is taking time to get everything started again, but the teachers are very active:
 - STEAM: a specialist has been engaged to train teachers on helping to develop STEAM projects.
 - Pre-K: starting with robotics and coding
 - Cycle 2: shadow puppet project is going strong
 - Cycle 3: the bee project, also in preparation for the science fair. This will include a hydroponics setup in the spring which will be used to encourage pollination by the bees. We will also sell honey, pesto and other products fulfilling the entrepreneurship angle. Depending how this goes, see if we can connect with a larger organization
 - General projects:
 - battery recycling implicated with St. Leonard EcoCenter
 - Interschool sports tournament; parascholaire theater
 - We have also started a garden with a possible marketplace component

- The Leadership program is ongoing
 - The Chair Project is ongoing and will include participation by Montreal's East End schools. Mr. Gill will speak with the students.
 - Please understand the pandemic also caused a delay in many childrens' education and there is catching up on some of the basics before going into the projects.
 - Considering the time it takes to implement projects, we should work together in spring with parents to establish the projects that are to be undertaken the following year.
- Mr. Andrew: Physical Education:
 - Thanks to the parents who volunteered to help with Grade 6 pizza lunch
 - Volleyball tournament at Rosemount on Monday, against West and Private schools. Other East End schools were at Laurier MacDonald. HM students played exceptionally well.
 - Cycle 3 basketball activities will start again.
 - Ms. Veronica, Music:
 - Finished the CBC competition recording and it should be up on the CBC YouTube channel. Will be shared on Google Classroom, Instagram, and Facebook. Parents are encouraged to share!
 - December 21 Holiday Concert at 9 am, in person. Only two seats per family. Everyone will be asked to bring a canned good for the community. Still identifying the charity.

 - Book fair was for students today, November 23, and parents tomorrow, November 24.
 - Next H&S meeting is December 8

- Angelo Irrera reports (via Verena Garofalo) that there is a no change in the budget.

Commissioner's Report

- Thanks Verena Garofalo and Merika Ramundo for meeting with the commissioners for an update on Bill 21 (see CPC report)
- Drugs education:
 - Brought in local police to speak with students at Laurier MacDonald (Sec. 4/5) about these issues
 - Will try to bring it to all high schools
 - Was asked about doing this at the Grade 6 level, and it is probably too early for this age group

Central Parents Committee Report

- Merika Ramundo, report from November 3, 2022 CPC meeting:
 - 1) Commitment to Success Plan:
 - Presentation of the consultation process for the development of an updated Success Plan by T. Mangal (ppt to come, to be distributed to GB members)
 - CPC members were asked to give feedback via Padlet on 4 questions:
 - What challenges do you think the school board will face in upcoming years with its schools and centres?
 - Due to impacts from COVID, what specific issues will the school board, schools and centres be presented with in the future?
 - What are your expectations of the school / school board concerning the educational success of your child?
 - To what extent do the services that the school board currently offers contribute to the educational success of your child?

 - 2) CPC voted to organize an event targeted to parents (last year's event was a conference). Other parents, not just CPC members can be involved.
 - 3) Meet and Greet with CPC and GB Chairs organized by Joe Ortona to update community on Bills 21, 40, 96 (Verena to report).
 - 4) Technology procurement issues at several EMSB schools. Delegate from Merton brought forward an issue around procuring laptops for her school. Several delegates from other schools identified issues. Flagging this issue for H&S fundraising initiative to procure technology (Laptops? Chromebooks?) for HM.
 - 5) Central marketing committee discussed low enrolment schools and measures to be taken. Radio ads in between traffic reports are the most effective way to reach parents. Social media ads are also a great "bang for your buck". Some schools are holding open houses too late in December and January. A recommendation was made last year to hold them in October-November.
- Verena Garofalo, update on Bills 21, 40 and 96:
 - Meeting chaired by Joe Ortona, school GB Chairs, CPC representatives, and commissioners.
 - Went over Bills 21, 40, 96, what they target and their current stages as they do not yet apply.
 - If we really want to understand what our rights are, we need to look at the February 7, 2018 version of the Education Act, available on the EMSB website.
 - Also note that as a Governing Board, we can pass resolutions against the bills

Question Period/Varia

- The GB board presence at the Open House was a great success. It seemed to leave a good impression on prospective parents to hear from other parents at the school.
- Ms. Marotta will circulate the budget, and we will devote 10 minutes at the next meeting.

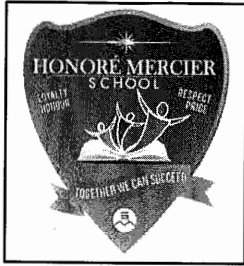

○ Complaints Process

- Parents are very confused by the process, particularly as it is laid out on the website (see attached document, specifically the chart at the end). The steps and chart are very confusing and it's very difficult to find the information you need. EMSB Assistant Director General Pela Nickolettopoulos Assistant Director General agreed and the EMSB admin will improve the chart and instructions.

- If parents want to express a concern, they are first to speak to the teacher (if the concern is class-related) followed by the principal. If the concern has not been addressed after going to the teacher and principal, then Pela Nickolettopoulos suggested calling the Regional Director for your sector (in HM's case, EAST). It is the job of the regional director to try to resolve issues and they may bring in the principal, teachers, and director general to work as a team to try to resolve things.
- If the issue is still not resolved, then the secretary general and student ombudsman will be brought in.

○ Principal Selection Criteria.

- Every year GBs from across all school boards and service centers are asked to develop the Principal Selection Criteria. These criteria are then sent to the EMSB administration for consideration when looking at reallocation and transfers for the next year.
- GBs are called to do this exercise by the government of Quebec (as stated in the Education Act).
- GBs are asked to send along a statement listing skills and qualities they want to see in a principal that would be a good match with the culture of the school.

- **Follow up on Next Level Hockey Program**
Initial follow up discussions prompted by **concerns/complaints** raised by parents and **letter** presented to governing board regarding many important issues. Productive initial meeting (2 weeks ago) with Miss Marotta, Verena Garofalo, Tony Campione and Mr. Peter to further discuss issues related to insurance, safety of players, values (communication), service/program offered (focus on skill development vs skill development and games, certifications, ...Miss Marotta was able to answer many questions at this initial meeting. Outcome of this meeting was to follow up with a meeting with Michael.

2nd follow up meeting with Michael to be held on Thursday (Verena, Miss Marotta, Tony, faculty member) to address outstanding questions and to ensure that expectations will be met for the program while keeping in mind the values are in line with Honoré Mercier Community. Example of some concerns raised: initial program offered in 1st year focused on skill development (30 hours/set price) vs 2nd year was split between skill development and games (15/15). Issues related to safety, incorporation, training/certification. These will be discussed further with Michael for a better understanding and make sure we can continue with his program in a positive direction. To be continued and reported back to GB.

EMSB Parents Committee (PC) summary

January meeting

- Bill 96 information session (Merika can send document to any parents who wish to see it). Representatives from the Quebec Community Groups Network presented on Bill 96 implications on social services including Education. They explored the various articles that affect English education and how it can affect the Anglophone community generally. The PC will be moving forward on drafting a letter to be sent to the government. GBs will be asked to participate. Other links of interest:
 - Open letter to David Lametti regarding C13;
 - The QCGN Language Rights Page; and,
 - The link to sign up for the Daily Briefing.
- Parents received conflicting information regarding school trips outside of Canada. The administration and the Legal Department have put together guidelines for the schools to follow with regard to trips abroad. The guidelines have been distributed recently to principals.

February meeting

- Budget building process for 2023-2024:
 - Financial Services consulting with PC and GBs on the budget building process this winter/spring. Adoption of numerous activities will occur in June.
 - Way of getting feedback as to what the local community thinks is important in terms of where money is spent. What does the community want? What do they value?
 - Not a rubber stamping activity – GBs and PCs are asked to reflect on needs and use guiding principles to work with the administration to outline resource needs.
- School calendars:

- Pela Nickoletopoulos, Assistant Regional Director mentioned that GBs should be seeing the calendar for next academic year soon. Pela would be sending a note out to principals to ask them to consider parents / GB input before the local school calendar is set in stone.
- Parents Committee put forward a motion for the EMSB to consider a series of recommendations regarding the proposed school calendar for 2023-2024.
 - Schedule a ped day after Halloween on November 1.
 - No half ped days.
 - Winter break and March break to be the same at all 5 service centers and school boards on the island of Montreal. Pela mentioned that the 5 centers and boards have met and that this was being addressed. In principle, all have agreed to set the same dates for these breaks.
 - Note “equalization days” so that the same subjects are not always missed if the school has Mondays and Fridays as ped days.
- **Bullying:**
 - PC passed a resolution to ask the EMSB to make bullying training sessions mandatory for all staff
- **PC events:**
 - Timeframe: week of May 28 - June 4, 2023 (to run in conjunction with the U.N.'s Global Day of Parents on June 1).
 - Keynote - Sunday, May 28 or Sunday, June 4, 2023. Afternoon 2-3 hours. Hybrid - onsite + live streamed + recorded to be posted at a later date. Light refreshments will be served (e.g. coffee, tea, juice, muffins, cookies, etc.) and daycare services are available on-site (needs to be requested when the guest RSVPs).
 - Lunch & Learn Series - Monday, May 29 to Friday, June 2, 2023.
 - 30 to 45 mins, launched at noon, one per day
 - Theme: Communications! Related topics could include special needs, artificial intelligence, Inclusion, accessibility, social media, healthy relationships, misinformation, health & wellness, technology, hands-on learning (trade school!), bullying/cyberbullying, mindfulness, peer relations, empathy, motivation, and engagement, etc. If you know of any speakers or sponsorship opportunities, please let Merika know.

Question Period/Varia

- **Registration Numbers Update**
 - lower than expected - 1 new pre-k class and 1 kdg class
 - enrollment period ongoing
 - Grade 6 cohort leaving (big cohort of 3 classes)
- **Why are raffles not permitted to raise funds?**
 - Not permitted as it encourages students to gamble (EMSB guideline)
- **Time per week allocated for physical education?**
 - Currently HM has 1 hour per week vs Pearson School Board which has 2 ½ hours per week (over 3 days/week)

- Group discussion regarding increasing physical activity /benefit for promoting school (enrollment)**
 - Would need to review allocated minutes per subject at the school
 - In order to increase physical activity – we would have to reduce time from another specialty (e.g. art)
 - Option for art can be taken over by other teachers as it has been the subject with most turnover in last year’s however need to follow rules from EMSB for time allocation to each teacher and specialty subject
 - Consequence of low enrollment – may lose classroom teachers and specialty teachers in accordance
 - Increasing physical activity time would enable HM to possibly secure specialty teachers. Low enrollment puts positions of Mr. Andrew, Mr. Peter and Miss Veronica in jeopardy. Plan needs to be put in place (see NEXT STEPS below)**
 - HM has been a pioneer in increasing physical education and health (started health booklet) before Ministry and EMSB suggestion for 150 min/week – need to continue with our strengths:
 - Pre-k & kdg: (165 minutes/week)
 - Grades 3-4-5-6 (150 minutes/week) – 2hrs Phys ed & 30 min health class
 - focus to increase minutes for (Cycle 1 students - Gr 1 and 2) – currently 120 minutes (90 minutes actual Phys ed + 30 min. health class). Suggestions for increasing Phys ed to 3x/week + health class**
 - Positive comments to build upon strengths of the school (physical education and music) to showcase them and potentially help promote the school (low enrollment issue) and secure the specialty teachers. Risk of losing 2 out 3 specialty teachers. Need to think creatively and plan ahead
 - Many benefits of increased physical activity for the students

Evidence of physical activity minutes at other schools or specialty subjects of interest to parents?

- all schools need to follow basic school regulations in terms of time allocation. Each school is different on how they divide the time with respect to their focus
- not aware of any research related to specialty subjects of interests by parents (re: enrollment)

Example from Edinburgh Elementary School (experience from Miss Marotta)

- 3 specialties – art teacher (who was retiring), science and physical education
- did not have a music specialist – taught by person hired by home and school – assisted classroom teacher with music program. Teachers did not feel qualified to grade music
- Solution: took advantage of retiring art teacher and decided to hire a music specialist. Classroom teachers felt more comfortable to take on the art class themselves.
- Solution specific to the school

Conclusion of the discussion is that the focus on Phys Ed and music would be a creative strategy to try to ensure that our specialty teachers remain in HM as well as benefit the students’ health and learning. GB in full support.

Lots of evidence for the benefits of physical activity for students and teachers (reference to workshop speaker at the beginning of the year – suggestion to reach out to the speaker for data)

NEXT STEPS (RE: Proposal to increase physical activity minutes, focusing on Cycle 1)

- 1) Miss Marotta – to review basic school regulations in terms of time allocation (Phys Ed, music, art) and prepare a proposal in accordance. Target date before enrollment report needs to be done.
- 2) Proposal to be reviewed with EMSB HR (ensuring proper time allocation for language FR and ENG within the specialty subject) for approval
- 3) Proposal to be presented at Staff Council (discussion already underway with specialty teachers) for approval
- 4) Proposal presented to GB for final acceptance




The offering of a scholarship for underserved students is an outstanding issue.

Michael from Next Level Hockey will be presenting at the May GB meeting to present the program's offerings for next year and to answer questions.



Recurring Issues at Governing board meetings.

- Low Enrollment

 - Governing Board cannot ask the EMSB to buy specific advertisements.
 - Governing Board cannot tell administration how to use social media

 - Mr. Campione advised that he sat with the EMSB as the outgoing Chair at the end of the 2021/2022 year. Mr Campione questioned the EMSB Pela Nickoletopoulos and she advised change a school program from STEAM to IB is a 4-year process. The School Governing Board can make this decision along with the community, however the EMSB will also need authorization from the Quebec Education Minister office.
